

Slaney fishing report 13 July 2011

Excellent sea trout fishing continues on the Slaney.

Good numbers of sea trout are still being caught on the Slaney with the middle to upper reaches of the river now holding the best stock of fish. The average catch per angler per evening seems to be between 3 and 5 fish with some good fish up to 2 pounds being landed. The best time seems to be between 10 – 11.30 pm when sport can be frantic. The main run of trout seems to have run now and fishing will probably slow down within a week to 10 days.
